

THE HEALING MASS and MINISTRY FOR HEALINGS

(A) **In case of open mass:** offered by Fr. Thomas Masatoshi Kodaira (O.F.M.)
and Fr. Paul Janocinski (O.P.) ;

PLACE: The Chapel of the University of the Sacred Heart (Seishin Joshi Daigaku)

LOCATION: Hiroo 4-3-1, Shibuya-ku, Tokyo, HOUR: 2:00 P.M.

In case of open mass Fr. Kodaira, the main celebrant, and Fr. Paul Janocinski, offer mass together monthly: usually on the 2nd Sunday. See the new information by HP.

(B) **In case of closed type mass:** no attendant. Such as **January ~ March, 2021.**

The following dates the type of mass are not settled whether it will be open type (all second Sunday) or closed type : Apr. 11, May 9, June 13, July 11, Oct. 10 (2nd Sun.),
Nov. 14, Dec. 12. **No open mass on August nor September.**

In closed type the priests will offer mass in turn once in a month around the 2nd Sunday at the chapel of the convent etc. without attendants. Nobody is permitted to enter the prohibited rooms of the convent.

In case of closed type mass it is recommended to pray for own healing and intercede for those who are included in the intention of the closed healing mass. One can pray where you are (for example at home) and convenient time (not limited at 2:00 p.m. on the 2nd Sunday). The Lord is omnipotent and knows each one's condition of the sickness, so trust in our Lord Jesus Christ, the Healer.
